

NMACD Region 1 Meeting Report July 13, 2021

Projects, Programs and Deliverables by Area of Natural Resource Concern

Urban Expansion and the Urban Rural Interface

- Completed approximately 43 acres thinning treatment on both private and Public OS
- Provided wildfire safety education totaling 66 hours of in-kind community match
- Distributed 50 free reflective house numbers for East Mountain Residents

Public Awareness and Education

- RiverXchange - 5th grade - 38 classes, 39 teachers, 859 students, 11,167 hours of program
- Arroyo Classroom - 3rd grade - 35 classes, 38 teachers, 670 students, 2,680 hours of program
- Watershed Stewards - Senior Citizens - 114 participants, 7 online presentations
- Alliance for Water Efficiency curriculum - 212 5th graders - Climate and Native Plants
- Rolling River presentations at various events - 663 people reached
- 15 new Tree Stewards training in 2020 added to program addressing urban canopy

Watersheds, Erosion Control and Drainage

- Provided review comments and suggested plan changes to 6 Subdivision reviews
- Residential Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI installation & video series program with Bernalillo County) 170 participants over 4 days of workshops, with 13 Ambassadors

Water Quality

- Initiated Upper Tijeras Creek Watershed Based Plan Draft to address nutrient exceedance

Water Availability Liquid and Solid Waste

- Supported free Spring and Fall "Green Waste Days" totaling 8,238 Cu.Yds. processed

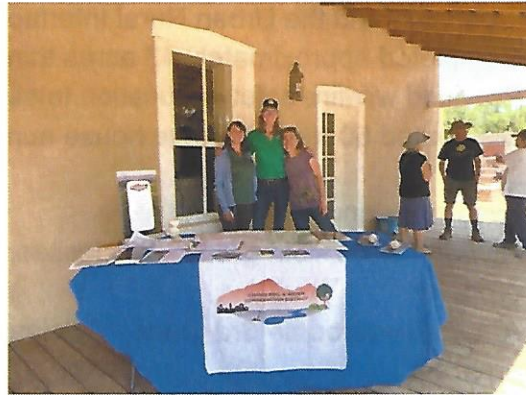
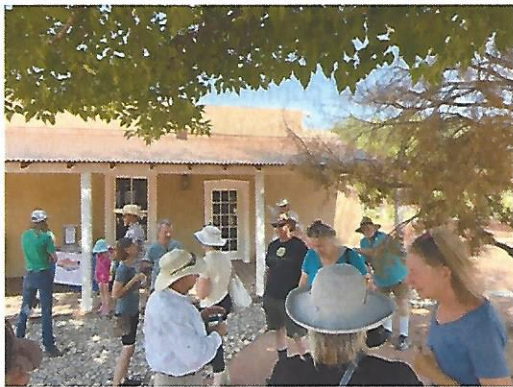
Agriculture and Soil Health

- Provided 5 Agricultural presentations to Grow the Growers developing Ag. knowledge
- Advising planning and process for Arenal Open Space and associated youth Ag. engagement on 35 acres in Albuquerque's South Valley

Wetlands, Wildlife and Recreation

- Planted and irrigated 7 acres in diverse cover crop, pollinator and wildlife mix at Candelaria Nature Preserve
- Management of 67 Acres of Habitat Restoration activities, with volunteerism and outreach components
